Another summer of worship, many fun events and music has come and gone. It is always a whirlwind of activity. Always done in the spirit of community, and always a big sigh once October begins and things slow down. It's time to gather ideas and save up the energy for next summer.

I feel blessed on Sunday mornings when I prepare for our service and coffee hour. It's a soothing task. After all is done, I take a moment to sit quietly and soak in the peace and beauty of Popham Chapel and thank the Lord for this special place. If these walls could talk they would have so many stories to tell. They have witnessed the history in this sanctuary for generations. They would talk of our joyful Sunday services filled with scripture, prayer and beautiful music. The Popham Chapel Board of Trustees work diligently to find ways to keep our buildings well maintained so we have a common ground for fellowship. This year was especially challenging with a leak that appeared, which had been a longtime, big-time issue, unbeknownst to us. We also lost shingles this winter which required replacing the west side roofs on both buildings along with the steeple. We had problems with our septic which have been resolved. We now have a new tankless water heater, which will save money on our electric bill. Thankfully, we have been blessed by some angel benefactors which helped us through a very expensive year. But life is full of surprises. You never know what will need attention next. We pray that our little old burner in the Chapel House will hang on for a few more years.

Being located on the water is a mixed blessing. It's stunningly beautiful, but it can be utterly ruthless. These buildings have taken a beating throughout the years. They are 128 years old! #### **Facilities and Maintenance:**

The summer of 2024 was one of unexpected and costly repair projects. Each of us reading this letter is well aware of the back-to-back winter storms the Maine coast experienced, as some of us were directly affected. Unfortunately, the Chapel and Chapel House did not escape the wrath of the wind, rain and high tides.

The Chapel House's basement was flooded with several feet of water, which was pumped out under the direction of our "Go to Guy", Matt Blake. Once the water was removed, Sewall responded to our call and restarted the furnace. The hot water heater did dry out and functioned, but ultimately it was replaced with an On Demand unit. It has been installed on the wall at a suitable distance away from any further flooding.

The furnace has been serviced and given a thorough inspection with the conclusion that it will function properly this winter. Considering its age, it would be a Capital expense if we are confronted with replacement.

It seems that every year we have had shingle repairs on our buildings. This year, as a result of the storms, the Chapel and steeple and Chapel House lost shingles. Rather than continue a patching routine, it was voted to re-shingle the west side of the Chapel, the entire steeple and the west side of the Chapel House. It was also agreed upon to use the best material possible with a rating to withstand winds of 120 mph. Horch Roofing Company was contracted to do the work for \$20,000.

Due to benefactors of the Davenport Foundation in Bath and an extremely generous contribution from one member of the congregation, this expense was covered.

On August 4, Sunday morning, the last day of the annual Art Show, there was a very heavy wind driven rain which came in and around the large north facing window in the Chapel House. Upon close inspection on Monday morning by Matt, a long going intrusion of water problems led to extensive rot above and below the window. Most of the vinyl siding was removed along with the wood siding beneath the window. It was necessary to reframe, replace the siding and close it up completely ahead of another rain storm on Friday. The cost of the repair was \$5,500. New sheet rock was installed on the interior wall, trim around the window was repainted. The Chapel entrance steps and front doors were all repainted at a cost of \$2,000.

Looking forward to next year, we have several maintenance areas we are considering. There is still painting required on both the Chapel and Chapel House at an estimated cost of \$5,000. The Chapel sound system is being considered. Our Sunday service, Summer Concert Series and occasional meetings would benefit this upgrade.

## **Popham Chapel Treasurer Report:**

The Popham Chapel Fiscal Year (FY) runs from June 1 until May 31 in the following calendar year. The Chapel's finances are in decent shape. We incurred some expenses we were not anticipating during the summer months, the replacement of the roof, the repair to the Chapel House front due to water damage, the replacement of the Chapel House hot water heater, and some other painting because of the winter storm. Fortunately, we received some extraordinary donations which helped to reduce these costs along with a grant from the Davenport Trust.

CHALLENGES

The challenges facing the financial health of the Chapel are identifying the elements that will need replacement in the next few years and then the development of a methodology on how to raise funds to create reserves. Starting in the spring, we will attempt to identify any mechanical equipment that will need replacement, develop an estimated cost for replacement, for both the Chapel and Chapel House. The same methodology will be applied to the structures for any maintenance required (Painting, Septic System, etc.). Anyone wishing to assist in this endeavor please contact us.

## **Popham Circle Report:**

It has been a busy year for the women of the Popham Circle in spite of many challenges, health and other, that have befallen on our members in 2024. While our human resources have diminished, our spirits are still strong. We still manage to undertake all of our regular fundraisers and even added an event in the early spring.

In May, we joined forces with the Phippsburg quilting group, "The Piecemakers", to put on an exceptional two-day community quilt show. Displays of over 100 new and vintage quilts, including local family heirlooms and pieces from the historical society collection, and a wide variety of other quilted items, filled the Chapel, the Chapel House and the library. Attendance was strong and enthusiastic both days, resulting in generous donations from visitors and brisk raffle sales. A beautiful handmade "Texas Star Quilt" created by Kathy Perkins and refreshed by her friends in the Piecemakers, was donated as a raffle prize and raised substantial funds for Circle benevolences.

Our annual craft and bake sale held in early July, which featured many familiar as well as some exciting new creations from our talented artisan members, also was a financial success. Once again, we took part in PBIA's George Popham Day festivities in August by operating the Circle Flare Night Café. More funds were raised providing good food and drink to the crowds coming to watch the parade, enjoy the bonfire on the beach and view Maine's First Ship, "Virginia" and her sister tender "Jane Stevens" cruise past Fort Popham. We wrapped up the summer season with a Lasagna Dinner in late September, held in honor of our longtime Italian Night chef, Jean Scott.

Support from our wonderful community helped us match record level public dinner sales set in prior years under Jean's formidable leadership.

As always, our year will end with our "Come to the Stable" free event held the first weekend in December. All are welcome to Popham to get into the real spirit of Christmas viewing our extensive display of traditional, unusual and unique nativity scenes in the decorated historic Chapel. Visitors are invited for complimentary light refreshments in the Chapel House where we now also offer homemade holiday foods suitable for gifts or personal pleasure for purchase. This year's sale will be augmented with a small selection of Christmas crafts for purchase and a raffle of a Christmas themed quilted lobster pillow and table runner set created by one of our master quilter members.

Proceeds from the holiday sale, like our other fundraiser income, help with the upkeep of Popham Chapel facilities, a founding purpose of our organization. Equally important are the annual donations we make at our December business meeting to: local charities that help Phippsburg residents with basic necessities; supplement resources for students and staff at the elementary school; scholarships for Phippsburg high school graduates; and depending on availability of funds, to other community charities and service organizations such as the town historical society.

Each November, Circle funds also are used for one of our favorite activities, providing Thanksgiving baskets for Phippsburg residents in need of some extra help during the holidays. This year eight families identified by staff at the elementary school, twice as many as in recent years, will receive holiday baskets filled with all the fixings for a traditional Thanksgiving dinner and many other nonperishable food items to stock a pantry that are purchased by the Circle as well as donated by members.
